# Post-introduction declaration for exempted introductions



## What is a post-introduction declaration?

A post-introduction declaration (PID) is a once-off declaration that you make at the end of the registration year for certain types of exempted introductions.

You submit your PID after the first time you import or manufacture (introduce) the chemical. After that, you no longer need to submit another PID for the same chemical introduction.

This is a reporting requirement under section 96A of the *Industrial Chemicals Act 2019* and section 36 of the *Industrial Chemicals (General) Rules 2019* (the Rules).

You must ensure that the chemical meets the requirements of the introduction category prescribed in the Rules and the Industrial Chemicals Categorisation Guidelines.

## How to determine if a PID is required

- The first step is to <u>categorise your chemical introductions</u>.
- If your chemical introduction is categorised as exempted, take note of the type of exempted introduction that applies.
- You will need to submit a PID for the following types of exempted introductions:
  - polymers of low concern
  - low-concern biological polymers
  - the highest indicative risk for your introduction is very low risk for example, chemicals that you have categorised as very low risk for human health and the environment.

## Who can submit the information

The following people can submit the information:

- the registered importer or manufacturer who introduced the chemicals; or
- their agent or consultant.

## When to submit a PID

The post-introduction declaration is due by **30 November** every year following the end of the previous registration period: 1 September – 31 August.

You can create and save your draft PIDs during the year and submit them at the end of the registration year.

Note: The first PID is due by 30 November 2021 and covers the period 1 July 2020 – 31 August 2021.

## Information that you will need to submit

For polymers of low concern:

You will need to know the total number of different polymers of low concern that you have introduced for the first time in a registration year.

For low concern biological polymers:

You will need to know the total number of different low concern biological polymers that you have introduced for the first time in a registration year.

#### For introductions where the highest indicative risk is very low risk:


You must submit a separate post-introduction declaration for each chemical you introduced for the first time under this exempted introduction type in a registration year.

#### The required information includes:

- the name of the industrial chemical for example, the marketing name, trade name or name that you use to refer to the chemical.
- the proper name (this includes the CAS name or IUPAC name) and the CAS number (if assigned) for the chemical.
- if you don't know the proper name of the chemical and the total introduction volume is less than 10kg, you'll need to submit the name of the person who holds information about the chemical's identity.

 For introductions where the highest indicative risk is very low risk (cont'd)

- If you don't know the proper name of the chemical and the total introduction volume is more than 10 kg:
  - you will need to provide the chemical identity holder's AICIS Business Registration number (beginning with 'NIC') and contact name.
  - we will notify the chemical identity holder to submit the chemical identity information separately; and
  - they must submit the chemical identity information before you can submit your PID.



- For introductions where the highest indicative risk is very low risk (cont'd)
  - the total volume and end use of the chemical

Apparel and footwear care products

- For introductions where the highest indicative risk is very low risk (cont'd)
  - the maximum concentration of the chemical at end use.
  - if the end use is in cosmetics, a statement about the use of animal test data to determine the highest indicative risk for the introduction.



## How do I submit a PID?

Step 1: Log on to the AICIS


Business Services online portal using your username and password.

**Step 2:** On the home page, go to the 'Post-Introduction Declaration (PID)' tile and click 'View your PID portfolios'.





**Step 3:** If you are creating a PID for the first time, click 'Create a PID portfolio' and complete the portfolio form.



**Note**: If you have an existing PID portfolio, go to Step 4. You can click on each Portfolio ID number to view the PID Portfolio information.




**Step 4:** Click 'PID dashboard' next to the relevant portfolio in the Actions column. If you don't see the 'PID dashboard' button, click the (+) symbol next to the portfolio's name.




**Step 5:** For a new PID, click 'Create a new post-introduction declaration (PID)'.

**Note**: If you have created a draft PID previously, go to Step 8 to submit your PID.






**Step 6:** Select the relevant registration year and the type of introduction that you are declaring from the drop-down boxes and click 'Save'.



**Step 7:** Continue to work through each section of the PID. The information you need to submit will depend on the type of introduction you have selected.

#### **Step 8:** Complete the declaration and check the declaration box. You can either:

- click 'Save' to save the draft PID; or
- click 'Submit' to finalise your PID.
