To do this, you should also complete **column 5** (details of any hazard characteristics known to you) and **columns 6 and 7** (related to the concentration of the chemical in the flavour or fragrance blend). Note: the concentration will generally be the same at introduction and end use. You **don't** need to work out the concentration of the chemical in each type of product at end use.

**Reminder:** you only need to provide information about chemicals if you are categorising their introduction as reported (low-risk flavour or fragrance blend introductions). You do not need to include information about any chemicals in the blend that are already on our Inventory and you are categorising their introduction as listed.
